A cocktail of inspiring speeches, interaction with experts, networking opportunities and great company awaited the guests as the D-Day started on a vibrant note. In his welcome address, Kurian Abraham, Founder Editor and Managing Director of *Dhanam* Publications, shared the joy of seeing Kerala on the road to become one of the best states in the country despite many handicaps, a dream that *Dhanam* had when it was launched more than two and a half decades back.

In his acceptance speech, T S Kalyanaraman expressed his happiness to receive the honour from *Dhanam* "which was the first magazine to enter this sector" He shared his observations on business, and pointed out that more than hard work, God's blessings and the acceptance of the public are the secrets of Kalyan's success. "My grandfather and father began this journey based on the values of transparency and honesty, and we are only following it."

Our policy is simple- VHP- Value, High-thinking and Patience, he said. "Giving customers value for money is important. High-thinking matters for long-term success. And we have been patient in making people aware of quality by fighting against impure gold."

"Kochi deserves to be the best city in the world, and the efforts of KMRL are focussed towards giving it a world class transportation system. We are giving people the latest technology to make their lives better," he said.

Growing at 11-13 percent, IT sector now provides 35 lakh direct jobs and one crore indirect jobs in India, he said. "There is potential for more growth as we move into an age where technology becomes the core of every activity."

Highlighting the five latest technologies that would bring in profound changes, he said that mobile phones, Internet of Things, Cloud Computing, Digital Payments and Universal Biometric Identity will be the key players of the digital ecosystem. "I cannot say that IT field is devoid of any future challenges. Most companies come to India because of the low expense, but they

expect innovation, completion of the project on deadline and high productivity at low cost. The challenge for Indian companies would be to equip employees to meet these demands."

And he had the audience eagerly awaiting his words as he spoke about the lessons he learnt. "Dream big and be paranoid about your enterprise, make it successful, profitable and sustainable, be focussed and don't ever change your values. And never forget the customer."

Santhosh Babu, Managing Director of Organisation Development Alternatives Consultants, was at his enlightening best as he asked entrepreneurs to have a clear vision and to remember the power of context in their planning. "An organization

will be successful only when each one of the employee feels a sense of purpose," he said.

Presenting examples, he highlighted the need for entrepreneurs to think different and motivate their team members to bring out the best in them. "Remember that culture kills strategy. Do not fall into a routine, and feel the pulse of the customer," said Santhosh Babu.
